

NEW HOMES REGISTRY REPORT



Report Context

The *Monthly New Homes Registry Report* provides information on new home registrations, which occur before the issuance of building permits and housing starts. As new home registrations are subject to change, they should be considered as planned or proposed projects. The report is intended for use by the residential construction industry, real estate community and researchers.

General Highlights

- In 2024, 46,196 new homes were registered¹ in B.C., including 5,860 single detached² and 40,336 multi-unit homes³.
- In 2024, total home registrations¹ are up 2.5% from 2023. Registrations for multi-unit homes³ increased 4.0%, while registrations for single detached homes² decreased 6.3%.
- In December, 5,430 new homes were registered¹ in B.C., a 130.5% increase compared with December 2023.
- Using a 12-month moving average⁴, there were 3,850 new registered homes¹ in December, a 7.1% increase from November for all registered new homes.
- Metro Vancouver accounted for 63.4% of all new homes registered¹ in December. Burnaby (1,137), Victoria (805) and Coquitlam (732) were the top three cities in registered new homes this month.
- In December, there were more multi-unit homes than single detached homes in Colwood, New Westminster, Coquitlam, Burnaby, Langley*, Victoria, Kamloops, Penticton, Kelowna, Campbell River, Merritt, Vancouver, Kimberley, Langford, Salmon Arm, Surrey, Richmond, Abbotsford and Parksville.
- In 2024, 18,430 purpose-built rental units⁵ were registered in B.C. Compared with 2023, the number of registered rental units decreased 3.9%.

Figure 1: Registered New Homes¹ by Building Type, 2002–2024







Figure 2: Registered New Homes¹ by Building Type and Selected City⁶, December 2024

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Single Detached Highlights

- In 2024, 5,860 new single detached homes were registered² in B.C. Compared with 2023, single detached registrations decreased 6.3%.
- In December, 398 single detached homes were registered². Compared with December 2023, the number of single detached registrations increased 9.9%.
- Using a 12-month moving average⁴, there were 488 new single detached registered homes² in December, trending at a 0.6% increase from November.
- Using a 36-month moving average⁴, there were 571 new single detached registered homes² in December, which is a 2.0% decrease from November.
- Vancouver (61), Surrey (53) and Delta* (18) had the largest number of single detached homes registered² in December.

Figure 5: Registered Owner-built Homes⁸, 2002 -2024




Figure 6: Registered Single Detached Homes² by Selected City⁹ in Metro Vancouver, 2023-2024





Figure 7: Registered Single Detached Homes² in Metro Vancouver, 2002-2024



Enrolled Multi-unit Highlights

- In 2024, 21,906 new multi-unit homes were enrolled¹⁰ in B.C. Compared with 2023, multi-unit enrollments increased 11.6%.
- In December, 2,496 multi-unit homes were enrolled¹⁰. Compared with December 2023, the number of multi-unit enrollments increased 237.8%.
- Using a 12-month moving average⁴, there were 1,826 new multi-unit enrolled homes¹⁰ in December, trending at an 8.7% increase from November.
- Using a 36-month moving average⁴, there were 1,915 new multi-unit enrolled homes¹⁰ in December, which is a 0.7% increase from November.
- There were 181 new multi-unit buildings enrolled¹⁰ in December. Most of these were duplexes (51.9%) and buildings of 5 to 50 units (18.2%). The largest building of 411 units was proposed to be built in Burnaby.
- In December, Burnaby (1,007), Langley* (642) and Coquitlam (511) had the largest number of multi-unit enrolled homes¹⁰ in B.C.

Figure 8: Enrolled Homes in Multi-unit Buildings¹⁰, December 2024




Figure 9: Enrolled Multi-unit Buildings¹⁰ by Building Size¹¹, December 2024





Figure 10: Enrolled Homes in Multi-unit Buildings¹⁰ by 12-Month and 36-Month Moving Averages⁴, December 2024



Purpose-built Rental Highlights

- In 2024, 18,430 purpose-built rental units⁵ were registered in B.C. Compared with 2023, the number of registered rental units decreased 3.9%.
- In 2024, rental units⁵ represented 45.7% of all multi-unit registrations.
- In December, 2,536 rental units were registered¹¹. Compared with December 2023, the number of rental units registered increased 102.1%.
- Using a 12-month moving average⁴, there were 1,536 rental units registered⁵ in December, trending at a 7.5% increase from November.
- Using a 36-month moving average⁴, there were 1,450 rental units registered⁵ in December, which is a 4.1% increase from November.
- There were 22 rental buildings registered⁵ in December. Most of these were buildings of more than 100 units (40.9%) and buildings of 51 to 100 units (40.9%). The largest building of 483 units was proposed to be built in Victoria.
- In December, Victoria (751), Kelowna (528) and Vancouver (344) had the largest number of rental units registered⁵ in B.C.

Figure 11: Purpose-built Rental Units⁵, December 2024




Figure 12: Purpose-built Rental Buildings⁵ by Building Size¹¹, December 2024





Figure 13: Purpose-built Rental Units⁵ by 12-Month and 36-Month Moving Averages⁴, December 2024

Background and Methodology

BC Housing is responsible for the administration of the *Homeowner Protection Act*, with a mandate to help bring about improvements in the quality of residential construction and increase consumer protection for buyers of new homes in British Columbia (B.C.). Under the Act, all new homes in the province must be registered with BC Housing. The registration of new homes in the public registry must occur prior to the issuance of building permits and housing starts. The new homes registry data measures residential construction activities at the beginning of a project before construction commences. Therefore, information in the Monthly New Homes Registry Report is a leading indicator of housing activity in B.C.

New home registration data is collected from Licensed Residential Builders and owner builders through the New Home Registration forms and Owner Builder Authorization applications. Over time, some minor adjustments may be made to the new home registration data as registrations are withdrawn or cancelled from home warranty insurance.

This report provides information on registered new homes by building type, building size, and building location. Figures for registered new homes include both multi-unit and single detached new homes enrolled with home warranty insurance, Owner Builder Authorizations, and, since the August 2016 report, purpose-built rental buildings that are exempt from home warranty insurance.

CSA-approved manufactured homes (modular homes, mobile homes and factory-built homes), floating homes, non-stratified hotels, motels, dormitories and care facilities are excluded from the definition of new home and are not reflected in the report.

Geographical terms in this publication are based on Statistics Canada's 2006 Census area. In February 2009, the regional district of Comox-Strathcona was replaced by two successor regional districts, Comox Valley and Strathcona.

Research

In collaboration with BC Housing, the Bank of Canada conducted a study in 2016 to assess whether or not new home registration data can be used as a leading indicator for economic activity in B.C. Study findings reveal that quarterly increases in new registrations for single detached homes have statistically significant predictive content for growth in real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) over the next one to three quarters, providing stronger signals compared to housing starts and building permits over this forecast horizon. End Notes

¹ Registered new homes includes: single detached and multi-unit homes enrolled in home warranty insurance, single detached homes constructed by an owner builder not covered by home warranty insurance, and purpose-built rental units that are exempt from home warranty insurance. Before August 2016, calculations of registered new homes in this report excluded purpose-built rental units.

² Registered new single detached homes includes new single detached homes enrolled with home warranty insurance or with Owner Builder Authorizations issued by the Registrar.

³ Registered new homes in multi-unit buildings (two or more dwelling units) include new homes enrolled with home warranty insurance and new homes in purpose-built rental buildings with a home warranty insurance exemption. Before August 2016, calculations of registered new homes in multi-unit buildings in this report excluded purpose-built rental units.

⁴ The trend analysis with moving average is based on a twelve-month and 36-month simple moving average of the monthly new home registration data. Data are not seasonally adjusted.

⁵ Purpose-built rental refers to new rental homes in multi-unit buildings that qualify for exemption from home warranty insurance. These exempted homes must be constructed for rental purposes, including social housing, and have a restrictive covenant registered on title restricting the sale of any dwelling unit for a 10-year period. Rental homes with a covenant may however be captured under "enrolled new multi-unit homes" if the unit is voluntarily enrolled with home warranty insurance.

⁶ Selected cities are the 10 cities that had the highest numbers of registered new homes in the reference month.

⁷ The five regional districts with the highest numbers of registered new homes in the reference month.

⁸ Owner-built homes refers to Owner Builder Authorizations issued by the Registrar. New homes built under an Owner Builder Authorization are exempt from licensing and home warranty insurance.

⁹ Selected cities are the 10 cities that had the highest numbers of registered single detached homes in Metro Vancouver in 2023.

¹⁰ Enrolled new multi-unit homes refers to new homes in multi-unit buildings (two or more dwelling units) enrolled with home warranty insurance.

¹¹ Building size is measured by number of dwelling units, which is equivalent to new homes.

¹² In this report, the five year average is the average of the most recently completed five years.
