Online Criminal Record Check Application Process for BC Housing Supplier - User Guide

Overview

This document has been developed to help guide BC Housing Suppliers on how to process online Criminal Record Check application for their employees, subcontractors/trades who will be providing services or performing work on BC Housing projects in accordance with the [Criminal Records Review Act](#).

1. What is the Criminal Records Review Act (CRRA)?

The BC Criminal Records Review Act states: “All individuals who work with children or vulnerable adults or have unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults in the ordinary course of their employment, or in the practice of an occupation, or during the course of an education program and who are employed by or licensed by or receive regular ongoing operating funds from the provincial government are covered under the BC Criminal Records Review Act.”

2. Do I need to complete a Criminal Record Check?

All Suppliers, their employees, subcontractors/trades who are providing services or performing work on BC Housing tenanted property or BC Housing funded and tenanted property/project must pass a CRRA check through the Ministry of Public Safety and Solicitor General Criminal Records Review Program (CRRP) prior to working on projects that place them around children and/or vulnerable people.

Note: RCMP clearance or any other third-party clearances are not acceptable and will not be considered equivalent.


3. How do I complete a Criminal Record Check?

Criminal records check can be completed online (with or without the use for the BC Services card and app). Using the BC Services card and app are recommended (this will allow the applicant to forgo additional verification steps and the need for manual documentation submission). 4. Details for Online/Electronic CRC Submissions

Online applicants can apply [here](#). You should be directed to the application landing page where you will input BC Housing's unique code in order to proceed:

Criminal Record Check

In British Columbia, if you work or volunteer with, or have the potential for unsupervised access to children and/or vulnerable adults, you are required to complete a criminal record check.

How do I submit a CRC request online?

To submit an online request for a criminal record check, you must:

- Be at least 12 years of age as of today's date.
- Have an access code provided by your organization.
- Have your identity verified by using the [BC Services Card Login](#). If you choose not to use the BC Services Card Login, your organization will verify your ID after you submit your criminal record check.

Access code:

Enter the access code provided by your organization. An access code is required to proceed with the online submission.

5. Frequently Asked Questions

1) My employees and I already have a criminal record check with RCMP. Why do I need to complete another check with BC Housing?

RCMP clearances or any other third-party clearances do not satisfy the requirement of the [Criminal Records Review Act](#). Therefore, they are not acceptable and will not be considered equivalent. Only CRRRA Checks conducted by CRRP will be accepted.

2) I do not have a BC Services Card. What is the next step?

If you choose not to use the BC Services Card Login, your ID will be verified by a BC Housing authorized representative after you submit your criminal record check.

3) I have an existing criminal record check clearance obtained from another organization. Is any further action required?

All clearance letters must be addressed to BC Housing for each applicant. We cannot accept previous clearance letters obtained from the CRRP that are addressed to a different organization. In this instance you will be able to share your criminal record check with BC Housing at no extra charge.

4) **Can all my employees complete their criminal record checks with the same access code you have provided for the online application?**

Yes, provided they have all been assigned to the BC Housing project and have been included on the submitted Declaration Form.

5) **I have already completed my criminal record check with the CRRP, I need to share my application with BC Housing, but I am being asked to pay again when I have already paid the processing fee of \$28. Why is this happening?**

If you already have a criminal record check with the CRRP and you are sharing your application, your details must match what is already in the CRRP system. If there are variances between the information provided, then the system might recognize that you are a new applicant and will ask you to pay again. Please contact 1-855-587-0185 option #2 to speak with the Criminal Record Review Program directly about this issue.

6) **I am not expected to be on site throughout the project, do I still require a criminal record check?**

No, only Suppliers, their employees, subcontractors/trades who will be providing services or performing work on BC Housing projects must pass a CRRP check prior to working on Projects that place them around children and/or vulnerable people.

7) **There is a fee of \$28 that I am being asked to pay to complete my criminal record check and I do not feel that I need to pay this. How do I proceed?**

All applicants are required to pay a processing fee of \$28 if your application is new and you do not have an existing criminal record check. There is no charge for sharing an existing criminal record check provided that the check was already conducted through the CRRP.

8) **I have over 100 employees that have already completed criminal record checks with the CRRP. Why do we need to do this again?**

BC Housing requires all clearance letters to be addressed to us and we need to ensure that your criminal record check was conducted under the same “works with” category. Any clearance letters that are not addressed to BC Housing will not be accepted. This means you need to apply to share your criminal record check with us.

9) **The access code you have provided does not work when I try to complete my application online. Why is this happening?**

Please ensure that there are no spaces after you enter the access code into the online portal. Please refresh the page and try again. If the code still does not work, please reach out to crc@bchousing.org for assistance.
